## Logline:

A brief window into London's underground Hardcore Punk Scene.

## Synopsis:

A short documentary that offers a glimpse into London's ongoing and thriving underground hardcore punk scene, exploring the dedication those within it have to keep it alive and kicking.

## Description:

Accept No Imitations is a 10-minute documentary film that gives a look into the london hardcore punk scene, with a focus on the overarching question "Why do they do what they do?". A music scene is something that takes drive and passion to keep alive, so what is it about this scene that makes people so dedicated? What is it about this style of music that gives people the energy to put so much into it? Featuring interviews with active members of the scene, it aims to give an answer to this question.



I'm Milo, an aspiring videographer with a new found passion for documentary filmmaking. Although I do have some experience in the medium before, this is the most major project I've done so far. Music is my biggest interest outside of video production, so it only made sense for my FMP to combine the two.

## STATISMENT OF CONTROLS

Music scenes like the one in London don't come around often, and when they do, they don't tend to stick around for too long. These things need to be documented whilst they are still alive, and that is what I intended to do. I didn't want to create a historical recount or follow a particular journey, but rather delve deep into the emotional side and explore why exactly those in the scene seem to have such an intense dedication to a form of music. From a design perspective, I want the style of the film to match the energy of the music it documents. Fast paced editing, energetic music, and a general feeling of positivity and power. Visually, the film emulates the D.I.Y. ethos of the punk scene. This is put across with the hand-made title sequence that uses physical props, and the handheld live show B-Roll.
